# A WORD FROM ZAINAB

A couple of years ago, a Daughters for Earth team member suggested that we replace public expressions that insinuate violence or aggression with ones anchored in our values and our commitment to supporting women at the frontlines of addressing climate change and biodiversity loss. It was both a fun and meaningful exercise to catch ourselves using such phrases and think creatively about how to replace them. One such phrase was "divide and conquer." In a world fraught with countless wars and divisions, we chose to replace it with "unite and spread." By this, we mean uniting in love and spreading that love; uniting in our commitment to supporting women and spreading that commitment to many more; and uniting in our reverence for Mother Earth while spreading that same reverence back to Mother Earth.

In this spirit of unity and love, we share with you all that we accomplished in 2024 and invite you to join us in spreading this commitment in 2025. We are humbled that, thanks to a global network of women and an extraordinary team, Daughters for Earth has supported 200 women-led initiatives across 50 countries, with 42% of these initiatives led by Indigenous women. We're also excited to share our efforts to celebrate women's incredible work through storytelling. So far, we have written 26 graphic novels highlighting the achievements of these women leaders, the science behind their actions, and practical tips for readers to join the movement to protect our planet both on the individual and community levels. Beyond that, our dedication to fostering a global women's movement has been showcased through platforms like Foreign Policy Magazine, Vital Voices, and many others.

With all this progress, I dare say we are just getting started. As we close 2024, we renew our fierce commitment to doubling down on our efforts to support women at the forefront of addressing climate change and biodiversity loss. Achieving this requires unity, collaboration, and, above all, love.

With that, I present to you the Daughters for Earth 2024 Annual Report. I invite you to read it and, most importantly, to join us in 2025 and beyond. Mother Earth needs each and every one of us to do all we can to protect, restore, and respect nature.

# DAUGHTERS FOR EARTH IS...

A fund and a movement focused on supporting, celebrating, and mobilizing women to protect and restore our Earth.

At the heart of everything we do is a commitment to community and the timeless values we learn from Mother Earth: collaboration, balance, generosity, adaptability...

As daughters, sisters, and stewards, we are shaping a future where both our shared humanity and our planet can flourish side by side.



### WE FUND WOMEN'S ACTIONS

There is no way to fully address climate change and biodiversity loss without the full inclusion of women. Women have consistently proven to be effective stewards of our planet. They take action, drive change, and educate their families and communities to create lasting shifts in how we care for the Earth. And yet, women receive less than two cents of every charitable dollar directed towards climate and environmental causes.

Daughters for Earth is flipping the script by funding women-led and women-operated projects that are addressing the environmental challenges we face today.

In just 2 and a half years since Daughters for Earth was born, we have supported 200 women-led actions to protect and heal our Earth, with a total of 4.05 million USD awarded to initiatives across 50 countries. Of these, 39% have gone to Indigenous-led efforts, and 55% have been directed to projects in mega biodiverse countries.

Our grant-giving model is grounded in trust—trust between our funders, advisors, grantees, and ourselves. This means we have shifted decisionmaking power from the traditional boardroom into the hands of women who are intimately connected to their work and their communities. This approach ensures that resources are directed where they are most needed and can make the greatest impact. It honors the wisdom of local women, values lived experiences and embraces the power of collaboration.

### Here's how it works:

We lean on our global network of women to help us identify initiatives that align with our vision for conservation, biodiversity protection, and regenerative agriculture.

Once these initiatives are identified, our all-Colombian and Panamanian team carefully reviews each one to ensure it is eligible for support and is making an impact on the land and their communities. Finally, we have entrusted nine wise women, each deeply rooted in their communities and devoted to protecting our Earth, to make the final decisions on grant-giving.

Through this experience, we've learned that trusting in women's leadership works. It is a process we are deeply committed to.

# THE HUMMING BRD FFECT

Once upon a time, there was a forest where all the animals lived in harmony. One day, a terrible fire broke out. The animals were afraid their homes would be destroyed. As the animals stood helpless, a tiny hummingbird flew to the river and dipped her beak in the water.

She flew back and forth to the forest, bringing drop after drop to put out the fire.

The other animals laughed at her, saying, "What are you doing? You're too small to make a difference!" But she replied, "I'm doing what I can- all I can -, why don't you join me."

The Hummingbird inspired the other animals to join her. Soon, the fire was extinguished, and the forest was saved. The animals realized even the smallest contribution could make a big difference.

They called it the Hummingbird Effect.



# **GRAPHIC NOVELS**

Our Hummingbird Effect campaign has come to life through beautifully illustrated graphic novels that highlight the stories of women around the world who are taking on climate change. With each novel, we honor the incredible work of these women and share the science behind their efforts. This makes every novel not just a beautiful story but a powerful educational tool.

We also provide tips to readers on what they can do at the personal and community level to reorient themselves toward protecting and restoring the Earth. Along the way, we help them learn how to relate to nature and its resources in a more sustainable way.

So far, we've produced **26 graphic novels** and have just released our **first animated film** that shares the story of one of the remarkable Daughters driving climate solutions.


### **EVERYTHING WE DO IS ANCHORED IN COMMUNITY**



Conversations were centered on how women are actively protecting nature and addressing biodiversity loss, with a focus on love, community, and connection to the Earth.

During this year's Earth Shot Prize Awards Ceremony that was held in Cape Town, South Africa, Daughters for Earth co-founder Jody Allen announced our exciting new partnership that will be anchored on:

### 1. Scaling support and energy to women-led climate change and biodiversity

protection solutions. We are going to build a more robust pipeline to share solutions with each other backwards and forwards, all to increase this nexus of information and make it more robust, pulsing with energy and urgency. Daughters will become an official nominator for The Earthshot Prize and in turn, The Earthshot Prize will share nominations of women-led efforts with Daughters to be considered for potential funding. They have already shared 200 with us so far!

2. Storytelling to unleash urgent optimism and action. Women bring faith in themselves and their communities along with perseverance; bringing more of their stories to life will shine a spotlight on game-changing ideas that motivate people to think (and act) big.

3. Collaborating on research and thought leadership to further demonstrate the unique role women play in driving climate and biodiversity innovation and impact. Through the partnership, we'll have more proof points and insights to influence other funders, helping more women changemakers scale and thrive.
